

4. Cultural scholarships

- 1. Remember that researching scholarships takes time and work. It is similar to a job sometimes, and it can pay off!
- 2. Be sure to watch your deadlines and check the requirements. Many scholarships need essays and maybe letters of recommendation.

- 3. Chances are greater for receiving local scholarships versus national scholarships, as there are fewer applicants.
- 4. The largest scholarships awarded are typically awarded by the colleges. Individual financial aid pages of the colleges often times list types of scholarships.
- 5. Private colleges have more scholarships available to help bring the cost down versus public universities.
- 6. Some out-of-state public universities have great scholarships for Illinois students.
- 7. Apply for financial aid (file the FAFSA soon after October 1st of senior year). You never know what you might qualify for in aid and possible grants
